## **Did You Hear What Your Horse Said?** with Susan Bartfay, Animal Communicator

Building a better relationship than you ever imagined with your horse is possible when you stop thinking and learn to pay attention. Your horse's body language, facial expression, ear and eye movement say a lot, but the foundation of a very rewarding partnership becomes possible when you really listen. Learn to recognize the difference between when you are waiting for your horse to respond to you (not listening) and when you are tuning in to what your horse is thinking and feeling in head, heart and body. Susan will show you the basic principles of animal communication with stories and exercises, and then you can practice with hard copy photos.

No cell phone or iPad pictures; please bring pen and paper and a hard copy photo of your horse *or other animal friend*.

Part 1: Introduce yourself and your horse or other animal, and share your experience when you felt a 2-way communication

Part 2: Anything you wanted to know about animal communication but had no one to ask

Part 3: Find a partner you don't know, exchange hard copy photos

Part 4: Brief meditation to clear thoughts and find your animal helper

Part 5: Write down everything you hear from the horse or animal in the photo

Part 6: Exchange notes with your partner

Part 7: Group share, and surprises

Susan Bartfay has taken animal communication instruction from Brenda Cunliffe, Dawn Allen, Penelope Smith, Carol Gurney, Anna Twinney and Amelia Kinkade. She specializes in emotional, behavioral, and relationship issues, and continues in her practice and outreach to animals to find new ways to address their physical health as well as emotional needs. Susan is Certified through the Bancroft School as an Equine Massage Therapist, and has trained privately with Dr. Renee Tucker "Where Does My Horse Hurt", and is Reiki attuned. Since adding a medical laser to her massage and communication practice she has been trained through The American Institute of Medical Laser Application to provide laser therapy for horses and companion animals.
